Simple Past Tense - Goldilocks and the Three Bears

NOTE: Each line has four beats. Extra beats in each line are kept with body percussion. The first syllable (or word) in each cell has the strong beat, extra words are unstressed and spoken quickly. Therefore, when the first word of a line is unstressed (such as 'the') it appears at the end of the previous line. (The first word, 'a', is unstressed, the beat falls on 'fa-mily')

The past tense verbs are <u>all</u> stressed, and are printed in **bold** text. The verbs 'ar<u>rived</u>' and 're<u>turned</u>' both have stress on the second syllable, therefore they are split between two cells.

It is a good idea to establish a steady body percussion beat pattern to keep going throughout the chant except where there are special actions. For example, something very simple such as:

And of course foot movements can also be integrated as the children become more adept at keeping a beat.

Actions should be over-emphasised – for instance, 'walking' should include arm movements and some degree of hip swaying.

It is set out for 4 groups or individuals, but of course this can be varied to any number or just one.
